1. Toiohomai group - SUSS4 'Investigates Social Fabric'

Connecting issues of gender, ritual and rites of passage, this exhibition visually examines how social expectations shape, constrain and reform identify. The 4th exhibition by this group of artists: Darcell Apelu, Donna Dinsdale, Lynette Fisher, Nicol Sanders-O'Shea and Anne Shirley.

2. PCANZ 'With Ruth in Mind'. Ruth Davey (1923-2023) was the godmother of printmaking at the Waikato Society of Arts, introducing the practice to the WSA School in the 1970s, was also a charter member of PCANZ when it was established in 2000 as CPCANZ. For this exhibition, PCANZ members were invited to submit work inspired by Ruth's prints, some who knew Ruth and her work personally. Additionally there are several of Ruth's works for sale,

proceeds of which go toward the Ruth Davey Merit in Printmaking prize which is given annually at the New Zealand Painting and Printmaking Awards.

3. WAIPRINT 2025. The annual WAIPRINT exhibition presents recent work by Waikato Society of Arts members and includes work by artists in all stages of their exploration of print, from veteran practitioners to newbies in their first or second term of classes. The prints exhibited are original and autographic works - they are made by hand with the artists showcasing a wide variety of techniques & methods of exhibiting.

This year's WAIPRINT Guest Artist is Lorraine Sabini. Lorraine indulges her passion for colour and process. Her exhibition 'Composition de Coller' explores form and texture, expressed through collage and sometimes topped up with fire.
