




### Feature artist:

Oliver McLeod - geologist and map maker.

Oliver has meticulously mapped the geology of Karioi, the maunga by the sea at Whāingaroa/Raglan. The complex geological history was compiled through extensive field surveys and hundreds of hours mapping the coats and forested upper mountain between 2016 and 2023. The strata are overlain by traditional Tainui place names bestowed by local kaumātua - some of which do not appear on previously published maps.

Artspost have one framed and a few unframed versions of the map, available for purchase in our retail area.

If you are looking for a venue or space to hire for a business event, consider Artspost galleries or one of the studios as great networking spaces. Workshops studio spaces are also able to be booked.


