## The bronzies: HOOKED ON BRONZE EXHIBITION

During the past year, a group of local creative folk came together to explore making their own bronze sculptures. The bronzies collective is made up of potters, ceramists, teachers, jewellers and a blacksmith - all of whom are inspired by the alchemy of fire and the lost-wax process of casting bronze sculpture. This process is quite involved and needs good team work, so the bronzies banded together to share (and in some cases make) the equipment and resources needed to get pouring. They meet in each other's studios and workshops to create and inspire and share lunches along with the latest news!

The bronzies invite you to their first exhibition at ArtsPost entitled HOOKED ON BRONZE. It will display a variety of bronze hooks and hangers HOT from their furnace.

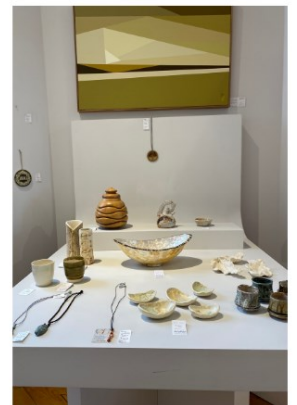
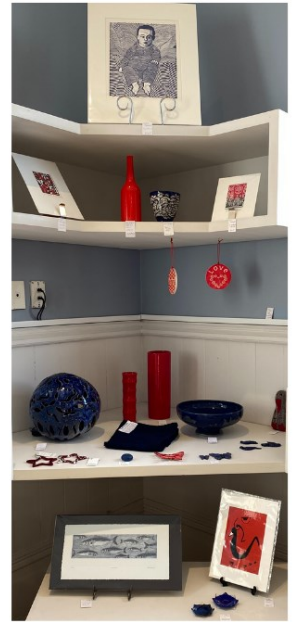

## Retail space

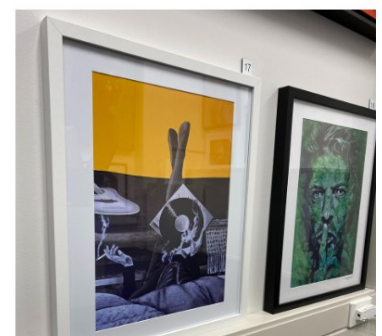
