Welcome to our first newsletter for 2024.

We hope you've all had a nice Christmas and a great start to the New Year. We have been busy behind the scenes moving into the ground level of ArtsPost and getting ready for the first two exhibitions which open on Saturday, 3 February. We had planned to have a soft opening for our dear tutors, sponsors and members but unfortunately, we have been flat out installing the Ruth Davey gallery into the old i-site space and going through the stock on hand. We thank you all for your patience while we are making this transition and look forward to seeing you all back at the WSA.

Upstairs the library has been moved into what was the Next Level Gallery. This space is beautiful and so much nicer to make the most of by taking time to sit and explore the extensive range of art books we have built up over the years.

Entry to the art school studios upstairs will be slightly different now as we have moved the office down to the ArtsPost level. During the day, everyone will enter and leave through the ArtsPost doors and go up the lift or through the lift doors to the staircase to get to their classes. After 5pm students will leave through the WSA doors as the ArtsPost galleries and retail space will be closed. This will be a change to what some of you have been used to for a long time and we do expect a bit of confusion at the beginning but with patience we should all get the new system over time.

You will notice a familiar face to some of you on a Tuesday in ArtsPost as we welcome Caroline Peacocke onto the team to help with projects as well as back up in retail. Caroline tutors our Experimental Printmaking class on a Monday night and works between Hamilton and Auckland as a consultant. On a Wednesday we have one of our wonderful children's art tutors, Josie Ward who is relieving at blue as well as back up at ArtsPost, when there is no exhibition running. Josie has a background in textile design.

A special thank you to the volunteers that have been coming in over the past couple of weeks to help us with this move by cleaning windows and tables and doing the stock take, Vicki, Sue and Janice. Lastly, thank you very much to Dale Gilmore, another one of our amazing tutors, who in a past career was a sign writer. He has been kindly painting our new signage around the building and we are very grateful to have this specialised talent available to us.

As part of the move, we have not been able to retain the ArtsPost signage and so have had to adjust this logo slightly. As the WSA created artspost in 1998 we can still use the name but now have the font in lower case to differentiate how it was. You will also notice we have started rebranding the WSA logo and this is slowly being phased into our brand over the next few weeks. We are all excited by these changes that have been happening while we have been closed and once again look forward to seeing you at WSA for a fresh start in 2024.

The NZPPA 2024 entries close on 18 February. Another great exhibition and award to look forward to and that will now be held in the artspost galleries. Looking forward to seeing all the amazing paintings and prints that come through from around Aotearoa for this prestigious award.

Remembering Ruth, 21 January at ArtsPost

On a steaming hot Sunday afternoon, friends and family of Ruth Davey gathered at ArtsPost to honour and remember Ruth Davey, who died 26 December, just 11 days after celebrating her 100th birthday. It was less than a week since WSA had taken possession of the ArtsPost ground floor, the rooms were empty, the shop closed, but the air conditioning was working and provided instant relief to the 90-plus people who arrived to pay their respects. WSA made the space available, the museum loaned chairs, invitations went out to Friends of the Museum and the WSA membership. The gathering was organised by a group of local friends who have supported the Daveys for several years; Lester Davey calls them the Vestal Virgins.

The rooms were decorated with framed Ruth Davey prints on the walls and large unframed works on easels. There were three slide shows running throughout: photographs of Ruth and her friends and family projected on the wall, scans of Ruth's sketches on a small digital frame and images of her prints on a larger computer monitor.


The talks began with a reading of a piece Ruth had written about an event in her childhood, when she was slightly mauled by a circus lion. Then several nieces and nephews who had come from out of town spoke of growing up with Uncle Lester (always teasing) and Aunt Ruth (always gentle, caring and perceptive). They spoke also of their cousin Sam and the devastation of his young death in an accident.

Closer to home, Susan Flight talked about the early days when she and Ruth more or less taught themselves etching from books. Anita Robertson spoke on behalf of the museum and read out a piece by Nadia Gush, one of the curators responsible for selecting the nearly 400 Davey prints that have gone into the collection. Peter Dornauf represented the Friends of the Museum (Ruth was a Life Member) and the Waikato Bequest Trust, which acquired a further 25 of her prints for long-term loan to the museum. Peter, who is writing a book about Waikato artists, also talked about Ruth's place in that community.

Janice Meadows spoke on behalf of the WSA, Print Council Aotearoa NZ and two distinguished printmaking colleagues who were unable to attend. She read a passage from Carole Shepheard's article about Ruth in Art NZ and relayed a message from Marty Vreede updating his contribution to the 2013 book Ruth Davey: Artist-Printmaker. She also gave voice to Lester, reading his piece in that book: "My view from the sidelines".

The new Ruth Davey Gallery (formerly i-site) stood empty but provided a splendid space for serving refreshments after the talks: bubbles, punch, sandwiches and cake. When ArtsPost reopens in February, Ruth's work will be the first exhibition in the new gallery.

Letter from Home; selected prints by Ruth Davey


Ruth Davey Gallery, ArtsPost

WSA has honoured Life Member Ruth Davey (1923-2023) by naming the new gallery after her and 'Letter from Home' is the inaugural exhibition in the space. The works in this collection touch on some of Ruth's favourite themes of human connection and nature and demonstrate her mastery of a wide range of printmaking techniques.



Ruth was a prolific artist and the Daveys have entrusted the remainder of her prints to the stewardship of WSA. These unframed prints are also displayed in folders as part of 'Letter from Home' and are available for purchase. All proceeds from the sale of Ruth's prints help fund the Ruth Davey Merit in Printmaking prize, which was established in 2020 and is awarded annually at the New Zealand Painting and Printmaking Awards (NZPPA).





This summer 26 artists from around Aotearoa will transform the urban environment and green spaces of central Kirikiriroa with 23 sculptures. Prepare to be surprised, excited and awed as you wander the trail.

We are sure you will enjoy the trail and don't miss the accompanying indoor exhibition at ArtsPost where there are smaller works. These are also for sale and available for immediate collection.

blue Gallery

'Traces' by Arwen Flowers, Peter Hsu, Teresa Martinovich & Sybille Schlumbom.

25 January to 10 February

This exhibition at Blue Gallery in Hamilton presents work by four students undertaking practice-led research for a Master of Visual Arts degree at Auckland University of Technology (AUT). Arwen Flowers, Peter Hsu, Teresa Martinovich, and Sybille Schlumbom interrogate the notion of Trace by examining site-specific gestural and material interactions occurring within various timeframes.

In the home, surfaces are valued for their usefulness, longevity and aesthetic qualities. Paint records imprints of Flowers' repetitious and spontaneous encounters between substrate and gesture. The emerging forms question values concerning domestication, care and place. Hsu's use of ink, brush, and body explores the spontaneous creative motion of Dao artefacts through sweeping calligraphic traces of the

invisible, unknown fount of all being that permeates all and ceaselessly gives rise to the infinite variety of beings. Martinovich investigates impressions of memory by pulling out fragments situated in domestic space and routine through the sensations of colour, light and gestural markmaking. Schlumbom traces time, place and materiality through a Mokuhanga print-based installation practice. The Gallery space becomes an archive for recording different site-specific installations in print.

The closing event will be held in the gallery from 1-2 pm, Saturday 10th February, all welcome.


