The Waikato Society of Arts is pleased to announce that Dr. Ed Hanfling has been appointed as the judge of the 2021 NZPPA. Ed's research, publications and knowledge in both printmaking and painting make him an informed choice to continue to uphold this prestigious award and acknowledge the high calibre of artists we have in Aotearoa.

Ed holds a Doctor of Philosophy (Art History) from University of Auckland (2005) a Master of Arts with First Class Honours (Art History) from University of Auckland (1999) and a Bachelor of Arts (Art History) University of Auckland (1997). Ed is currently a Lecturer in Art History and Theory at Dunedin School of Art, an External assessor for Ara Institute of Canterbury, the University of Auckland in MA theses/dissertations and for Wintec in Hamilton.
